1	RECOGNIZING that global politics, the world economy, and international power has
2	shifted and evolved drastically since the original signing of the United Nations Charter
3	on June 26th, 1945,
4	
5	ALARMED that the implementation of humanitarian aid and crisis prevention has been
6	blocked on multiple occasions, for instance: the attacks on Aleppo civilians, the Rwandan
7	Genocide, the violent oppression of Sudanese citizens in the Darfur region, and the US
8	invasion of Grenada, due to a veto or a threat of veto from a permanent UN Security
9	Council,
10	
11	NOTING that several countries are in support of this resolution, and, upon the potential
12	use of the veto power to deny this resolution, those same countries, in line with the
13	precedent set by Indonesia in their 1965 exit from the UN, have agreed to join The
14	Republic of Nicaragua in vacating their seats at the United Nations,
15	
16	1. IMPLORES an amendment to the UN charter to expand the Permanent Security
17	Council to nine members, including the addition of Brazil, India, Egypt, and South
18	Africa, and to balance the addition of these four new permanent members, the
19	non-permanent members of the Security Council will be expanded to fifteen rotating
20	members;
21	
22	2. URGES an amendment to the UN charter to alter veto power to require a majority vote
23	from the UN Security Council's nine permanent members;
24	
25	3. REQUESTS the United Nations to re-evaluate the permanent members of the Security
26	Council every thirty years in order to maintain a fair representation of the world's diverse
27	economies and political powers.
